

**DISCIPLING NATIONS IN OUR HOMES**

Every year the U.S. State Department provides scholarships for high school students from former Soviet Union states (including Armenia, Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Moldova, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan), and lands “with significant Muslim populations,” to attend a U.S. high school and experience American culture with a host family. This creates a remarkably strategic opportunity for Christians to disciple the nations we are praying for.

Proselytism (pressure to convert) is of course forbidden. But host families are welcome to include students in all their normal activities—including church—and to share and discuss their faith.

Many of these students will have their first opportunity to talk with someone who knows Jesus personally. Some will come to trust in His love and desire to share what they have received here with family and friends back home. And host families can build deep relationships for future ministry.

**HOST FAMILY COMMITMENTS**

The U.S. State Department provides each student with a monthly stipend, so the host family’s only obligations are to:

- feed the student,
- provide a bed and quiet place to study,
- assist the student in high school enrollment,
- invite the student to participate in family life,
- transport the student as needed, and
- have lots of fun together.

Should circumstances change, host families can withdraw as necessary.

**STUDENT STANDARDS**

These scholarship students carry a deep sense of gratitude and responsibility to represent their homeland well. And as minors, these students (age 15–17) are under a strict “zero tolerance” policy:

- No Drinking
- No Drugs
- No Driving

**YOUR OPPORTUNITY**

Students typically arrive in the U.S. in late Summer and stay for a semester or one full school year.

As of late August, 2013, scores of students were still awaiting placement, including boys and girls from **Bangladesh, Bahrain, Jordan, Pakistan, Saudi Arabia, Turkey, Tunisia, Egypt, Lebanon, India and Indonesia.**

Those who plan ahead can prayerfully watch for students from countries of specific interest. Please:

- Pray for host families that love Jesus.
- Share this opportunity with friends.
- Prayer fully consider opening your home.
